

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth of all things visible and invisible.



return the envelope in the collection basket or to the parish office no later than October 26.


All the envelopes will be bound together and placed upon the altar at each parish church, where your loved ones will be remembered at every Mass throughout the novena.
