all things visible and invisible.

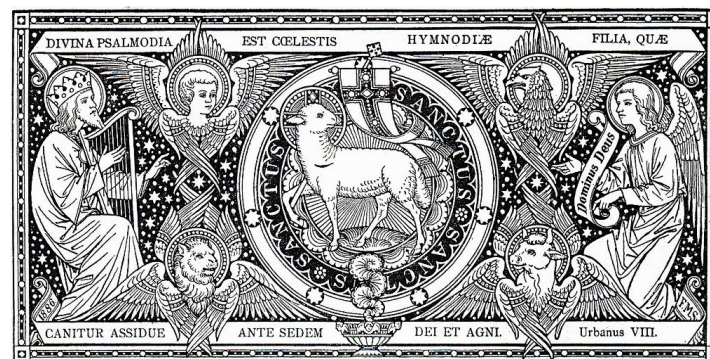
I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of
