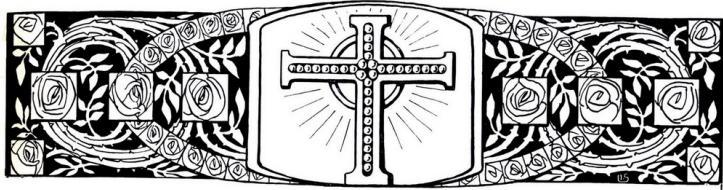

Gospel Homily Creed
